

Dear Friends,

2022 was an exciting year for us. We navigated COVID-19 and so many other challenges to come out even stronger this past year. The Alliance, now a partially remote organization, made the transition to gathering regularly at our new retreat center, H7 at Hope Mountain, in Colorado and at other program events across the country. With our focus on wellness, we are now hosting staff and professional training events in a place that naturally promotes health, healing and hope.

We saw the Family Justice Center "movement" continue to move and dreams continue to get bigger with the opening of second and even third Family Justice Centers in some communities and a host of new communities expand their CCR or MDT frameworks to grow into Family Justice Centers. We also gathered collaborative leaders and Family Justice Center Directors in Colorado for our Leadership Summit and toured beautiful Centers in Denver and Lakewood, Colorado. We also continued to be inspired and honored to work with our National and local VOICES members as they share their vision for the future and continue to be our compass. In the face of rising domestic violence homicides, suicides, officers killed in the line of duty by domestic violence stranglers, and racial injustice, our allied Family Justice Centers and Camp HOPE America programs continued to serve hundreds of tens of thousands of adult and child survivors of domestic and sexual violence and child abuse. Camp HOPE America is now expanding to 26 states.

Our Training Institute on Strangulation Prevention continued developing new resources, advocating for new laws, building a growing presence on social media and training over 40,000 professionals annually (virtually and in-person) on how to prevent homicides by improving their response to strangulation assaults. We also saw an impact in our efforts to bring attention to unsolved cold cases through our Hidden Homicide Project with one of our cases profiled on Dateline - the murder of Stacy Feldman - and conviction of Robert Feldman, her husband.

We encourage you to review this annual report to read about our work in Substance Use, Poly-Victimization, the science of hope, and our new, free Hope Tech Suite case management system for Family Justice Centers. We owe our success to YOU -- our funders, donors, sponsors, clients, volunteers, and survivors. We are extremely grateful to our staff and board for their support, friendship, and hard work. 


